BRIEF AUTHOR BIOGRAPHY

Peter C. Bjarkman is author of 30-plus volumes on sports history, including academic histories, coffee table pictorials, and sports biographies for young adult readers. Bjarkman's most recent title, a memoir detailing his nearly two decades of travels in Cuba entitled **The Yanqui in Cuba's Dugout: Travel's Inside Fidel Castro's Baseball Empire** (McFarland) will be released in late 2014. His **A History of Cuban Baseball, 1864-2006** (2007, paperback rerelease in 2014) is considered the seminal work in the field and the pictorial history of Cuban baseball, **Smoke: The Romance and Lore of Cuban Baseball** (1999, authored with photographer Mark Rucker), is widely recognized as a landmark volume in the field. Another recent volume, **Diamonds around the Globe: The Encyclopedia of International Baseball** (2005), was awarded **The Sporting News**-SABR Baseball Research Award and was also a finalist for Spitball magazine's CASEY AWARD as "Baseball Book of the Year." Bjarkman's 1994 study **Baseball with a Latin Beat: A History of the Latin American Game** earned the Macmillan-SABR Baseball Research Award. He also is frequently featured on radio/television (in America, Europe and Cuba) speaking on topics relating to international baseball, and in 2008 was the first winner of the Eduardo Valero Memorial Award from the SABR Latino Baseball Research Committee.

Bjarkman—who splits his year between Lafayette, Indiana; Zagreb, Croatia; and Havana, Cuba—has traveled extensively throughout Cuba (40 trips-plus) over the past two decades and was the first American interviewed extensively about Cuban baseball on Cuban national television (2001) during the 55-year history of the Cuban Socialist Revolution. He ranks as a foremost authority on the history of post-1959 Cuban League baseball and has attended numerous Olympic-style international baseball tournaments over the past decade. Bjarkman also covered the inaugural MLB World Baseball Classic (2006) for **Béisbol Mundial**, the second World Baseball Classic (2009) for **The New York Times**, and the third WBC in Japan (2013) for www.BaseballdeCuba.com, Bjarkman writes and lectures in English and Spanish and is currently the Senior Baseball Writer (since 2007) for www.BaseballdeCuba.com, the leading website source for Cuban League baseball coverage. He was also the recent subject of a feature front-page story in the **Wall Street Journal** (November 9, 2010) detailing his unusual stature and connections within the national baseball scene of Cuba. Most recently he was featured on the Travel Channel production "No Reservations Cuba" as celebrity chef Anthony Bourdain's personal guide to the inside world of Cuban baseball and Cuban baseball culture.

BIOGRAFIA CORTA EN ESPAÑOL

Peter C. Bjarkman es autor de más que 30 libros dedicado a la historia del deporte, incluyendo estudios académicos, libros de fotografia, y biografías para lectores jóvenes. Su libro *Smoke: The Romance and Lore of Cuban Baseball* (1999, con fotógrafo Mark Rucker) tiene fama como un trabajo decisivo en el campo de béisbol latino. Su obra maestra, *Diamonds around the Globe: The Encyclopedia of International Baseball* (2005), ganó dos premios (*The Sporting News*-SABR Baseball Research Award y finalista para el *Spitball* CASEY AWARD como "Mejor libro del año" escrito sobre la pelota). Su obra de 1994, *Baseball with a Latin Beat: A History of the Latin American Game*, también fue libro premiado (Macmillan-SABR Baseball Research Award). Bjarkman aparece con frecuencia en varias programas de la radio y la TV norteamericana como un experto sobre béisbol internacional. In 2011 aparecía en la programa (Travel Channel) "No Reservations Cuba" como la guia para el famoso chef Anthony Bourdain durante su documental sobre la cultura y la gastrónomia habanera.

Bjarkman permanece en Lafayette (Indiana, EE.UU.) pero visita a Zagreb (Croacia), a La Habana (Cuba), a Holanda, y a otras locales en Europa y Asia varias veces cada año. Fue el primer norteamericano entrevistado (en 2001) de largo por Cubavisión sobre la tema del deporte nacional. Bjarkman asistió a la mayoria de los torneos internacionales de pelota durante los ultimos quince años y escribió reportajes sobre los Mundiales de 2005 (Holanda) para *Prensa Latina* (el sitio de web en inglés). Su obra seminal sobre la pelota cubana, *A History of Cuban Baseball, 1864-2006*, salió con un gran éxito en 2007. Bjarkman ganó su doctorado (en lingüística) de la Universidad de Florida (1976) y trabajo más de 20 años (1966-1986) como profesor de lingüística, idiomas y literature. Desde 2007 el ha trabajado como "Senior Baseball Writer" por el reconocido sitio web www.BaseballdeCuba.com (el sitio web más popular del deporte nacional de Cuba).

Bjarkman esta en el momento escribiendo una cronica personal sobre sus dos decadas de adventuras viajando en Cuba y también siguiendo el equipo nacional durante torneos internacionales en otros partes del mundo. Ese libro saldrá al fines del año 2014 con el titulo "The Yanqui in Cuba's Dugout: Travels Inside Fidel Castro's Baseball Empire" (McFarland & Company Publishers).
